The final resolution of the first Environmental Strategy Conference in Potsdam in April 2024 states:

“The global environmental catastrophe has begun and will drag all of humanity into the abyss unless a fundamental change of course is made.”

The focus of the conference was on uniting the environmental movement and the labour movement to create a united front.

Among the 500 participants, there was consensus: the militant environmental movement must also be critical of society and capitalism.

Since then, the situation has worsened due to wars, destruction, arms build-up and the rise of fascism.

The majority of people worldwide, especially the poor, however, long for peace, democracy and the preservation of nature and the environment.

That is why we want to exchange ideas internationally and join forces.

We need a broad alliance, including the women's, peace, refugee, anti-fascist and youth movements. It is high time for joint action!
